<u>Aerodromes and Landing Places in Switzerland.</u> <u>Customs aerodromes</u>

A. Aerodromes.

- 1. <u>Dübendorf.</u> Military and civil airfield. 2 heatable hangars. 20 wooden hangars, workshops for all repairs available. Gasoline and oil stores. Surface: approx. 400/1000 m. Permanent service staff.
- 2. <u>Lausanne</u> (Blécherette). Civil airfield. 1 wooden hangar. Workshop for small repairs. Gasoline and oil stores. Permanent service staff. Surface: approx. 300/500 m. Signage: a large circle painted in white on the hangar roof.
- 3. <u>Geneva-Cointrin</u>. (Still under development). Hangars and repair shops under construction. Surface: 300/1200 m approximately.

B. Airports.

- 1. Zurich (Zürichhorn). Wooden hangar with «slip» of the Ad-Astra company. Gasoline and oil stores.
- 2. Romanshorn.
- 3. <u>Lucerne</u>. Balloon hangar (currently unusable).
- 4. Lugano. Wooden hangar with «slip» of the Ad-Astra company. Gasoline and oil stores.
- 5. <u>Geneva</u> (Eaux-vives). Hangar planned. «Slip». Currently machines can be accommodated in the shipyards in Corsier.
- 6. Lausanne-Ouchy.
- 7. Locarno. Wooden hangar with «slip» of the Ad-Astra company.
- 8. Rorschach. Wooden hangar (Station of the Ad-Astra company). Gasoline and oil stores.
- 9. Kreuzlingen.
- 10. Ermatingen.

Other Aerodromes and Landing places available

A. Aerodromes

- 1. Frauenfeld.* (Military exercise site). Wooden military hangar. Gasoline and oil stores. Surface: approx. 300/400 m.
- 2. Spreitenbach.* Wooden military hangar. Used by civil Societies. Surface: approx. 200/400 m.
- 3. <u>Bern-Oberlindach</u>.* Wooden military hangar. Rented to civil company. Gasoline and oil stores. Surface: approx. 150/250 m.
- 4. Avenches.* 2 wooden military hangars. Surface: approx. 200/400 m.
- 5. <u>Bellinzona</u>.* Military hangar. Gasoline and oil stores. Surface: approx. 200/400 m.
- 6. Thun.* (Military exercise site). 4 wooden hangars available. Workshops for all repairs. Permanent service staff. Surface: approx. 150/700 m.
- 7. Aarau (Schachen)* Military exercise site. Surface: approx. 200/400 m.
- 8. <u>St. Georges</u> (Geneva). Wooden hangar. Bumpy terrain. Will soon be replaced by Cointrin. Surface: approx. 150/300 m.
- 9. Porrentruy. Bessonneau¹ belonging to a civil company. 1 km south of Porrentruy. Surface: approx. 200/300 m.
- 10. Courtedoux. Good terrain. Surface: approx. 150/250 m.
- 11. Interlaken. Wooden hangar belonging to a civil company (unusable in rainy weather). Surface: approx. 300/500 m.
- 12. La Chaux-de-Fonds. (Eplatures). Good terrain. Surface: approx. 150/300 m.
- 13. Basle. Under construction. Gasoline and oil stores.
- 14. Bex Surface: approx. 150/200 m.
- 15. <u>Bière</u>.* (Exercise site). Military hangar. Gasoline and oil stores.
- 16. Colombier.* Military exercise site. Surface: 100/500 m. adverse atmospheric conditions.
- 17. Samaden. Surface: approx. 200/600 m.
- 18. Flüelen. Surface: approx. 150/400 m.
- 19. Montana. Surface: approx. 100/250 m.
